God's Word for this Week

We know that the cross was an instrument of torture and execution. However, Scripture also uses the term "cross" to refer to any suffering that one endures because he is believer: the painful denial of the desires of the flesh; ridicule and persecution from unbelievers; etc.

Today, Jesus asks us to rethink suffering under the cross. It is not pointless pain. Our crosses are not how we pay for sin. Jesus already did that on His cross. Our crosses are not redemptive, but they are constructive. Any suffering unbelievers face is only bad, a foretaste of worse to come. But the suffering believers face under the cross is only good, a way Christ connects us tightly to Himself with fire-tested faith.

Likewise we spend 40 days in Lent, fighting Satan, fighting his lies, and learning discipline from how Jesus defeated our greatest foe.


May this time of repentance, renewal, and growth in spiritual discipline equip and empower you to fight any battles that might come your way.

Scripture encourages us to "fight the good fight of the faith" (2 Tim 4:7) and to "put on the full armor of God" (Gal 6:11) that we may take our stand against evil in every form. God has given us all that we need to serve Him, and to resist sin and evil . . . yet we have grown weak, we have been lazy, and we have been unprepared in this struggle.


We have failed Him, in a million different ways, and we know it. We have been wounded by our own sins and the sins of others. Therefore we confess before God:

We feel the pain of our guilt. We have been wounded by our mistakes. We have listened to the lies of the Enemy and have hurt ourselves and others. We have strained our relationship with our Lord and have fallen down in our service to Him and all those around us.

Thankfully we have a High Priest who can actually sympathize with our weaknesses, for He was tempted in every way, just as we are — yet He was without sin. (Heb 4:15) The Law requires everyone to be cleansed with blood, for without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness. (Heb 9:22)

Therefore, Christ was sacrificed once, to take away the sins of us all (Heb. 9:28) and by that sacrifice He has made perfect forever those who are being made holy. (Heb. 10:14) Now hear the proclamation of your Savior, made through His called servant and at His command: Your sins are forgiven in the Name of the Father, the Son + and the Holy Spirit.

Amen. We have been made perfect forever in His blood, and we are being transformed by His power as God the Holy Spirit works in our hearts and lives. We follow Christ – cross now, glory later.

¹³One day when Job's sons and daughters were feasting and drinking wine at the oldest brother's house, ¹⁴a messenger came to Job and said, "The oxen were plowing and the donkeys were grazing nearby, ¹⁵and the Sabeans attacked and made off with them. They put the servants to the sword, and I am the only one who has escaped to tell you!"

¹⁶While he was still speaking, another messenger came and said, "The fire of God fell from the heavens and burned up the sheep and the servants, and I am the only one who has escaped to tell you!"

Second Reading

Romans 5:1-11

¹Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ²through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we boast in the hope of the glory of God. ³Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; ⁴perseverance, character; and character, hope. ⁵And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.

⁶You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. ⁷Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die. ⁸But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

⁹Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through him! ¹⁰For if, while we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life! ¹¹Not only is this so, but we also boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

Jesus said: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me."

Gospel Reading

Mark 8:31-38

³¹He then began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again. ³²He spoke plainly about this, and Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him.

³³But when Jesus turned and looked at his disciples, he rebuked Peter. "Get behind me, Satan!" he said. "You do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns."

³⁴Then he called the crowd to him along with his disciples and said: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up

their cross and follow me. ³⁵For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me and for the gospel will save it. ³⁶What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? ³⁷Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul? ³⁸If anyone is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man will be ashamed of them when he comes in his Father's glory with the holy angels."

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Sermon

Mark 8:31-38 "It's the CROSS – or it's HELL."

Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

Prayer of the Church

Gracious Lord, according to Your will and promise, You sent Your Son into our world to atone for sin and restore eternal life. You planned His path to the cross, and He followed it perfectly. Your Spirit led Him to endure the temptations of Satan, but He triumphed. Your own people rejected His message, but He persevered. He confronted the blindness of unbelief, the confusion of doubt, and the hurt of death but was not deterred as He proclaimed Your kingdom to the least, the last, and the lost.

Guide us to follow Christ by faith as we walk the road of temptation and trial. Spare us from falling into Satan's traps, and teach us to use Your Word as a weapon to fight against all devilish lies and deceptions. When we fall—and we surely will—lift us up again with Your forgiveness and grace.

As we hear and contemplate the holy record of our Savior's passion and death, use the sharp message of the law to empty us of pride and self-reliance. Humble us as we view the Savior in His humility, remembering and believing that He endured the cross so we might be freed from its horror. In His suffering show us our healing, in His grief show us our joy, and in His death show us our life.

Protect all who are bearing the cross of persecution and disdain.

Supply Your power to those fighting temptations and addictions. Watch over all who are sick and suffering in body, mind, and heart. We pray especially for children who are abused, forsaken, or ignored. Comfort all Your troubled people with the sweet peace that only Jesus can bring.

Hear our prayers, Lord, for the sake of Jesus, whose journey to the cross we remember during the days of Lent. Comfort and strengthen us by His life and death on our behalf, and thrill us as we look forward to celebrating His victory on Easter.


We lift them up to the Lord.

forever and ever. Amen.


Words of Institution
