Confession & Absolution

After His baptism, Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness fighting Satan and fighting against temptation.

Likewise we spend 40 days in Lent, fighting Satan, fighting his lies, and learning discipline from how Jesus defeated our greatest foe.

May this time of repentance, renewal, and growth in spiritual discipline equip and empower you to fight any battles that might come your way.

Grant us your Holy Spirit, Lord, and be with us always.

Bless us O Lord, as we gather here today, to once again witness, the miracle of Holy Baptism.

Our Savior Jesus Christ commanded Baptism when He said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

All of us are born into this world with a deep need for Baptism. From our parents we inherit a sinful nature; we are without true fear of God and true faith in God and are condemned to eternal death. But while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. He took away our sin by giving His life on the cross. In Baptism, He clothes us with the robe of His righteousness and gives us a new life. We recall what Baptism means for our daily lives:

Baptism means that the sinful nature in us should be drowned by daily sorrow and repentance, and that all its evil deeds and desires be put to death. It also means that a new person should daily arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.

As baptized children of God, we confess our sins:

Holy God, gracious Father,

I am sinful by nature

and have sinned against You in my thoughts, words, and actions.

I have not loved You with my whole heart;

I have not loved others as I should.

I deserve Your punishment both now and forever.


But Jesus, my Savior, paid for my sins with His innocent suffering and death.

Trusting in Him, I pray: God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

Silence for meditation and reflection

God saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit and united us to the death and resurrection of Jesus. Every day God forgives your sins, removes your guilt, and strengthens you to defeat Satan's power. His promise is for you and your children, and He will never forsake you. Your sins are forgiven. You are clothed with Christ. You are at peace with God now and forever.

Sacrament of Holy Baptism

The Rite of Baptism continues at the font.

The Gospel according to St. Mark:

People were bringing little children to Jesus for Him to place His hands on them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this, He was indignant. He said to them, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it." And He took the children in His arms, placed His hands on them and blessed them.

Joanna Grace Kroll, I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Receive the sign of the cross on the head and heart + to mark you as a redeemed child of Christ.

The almighty God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has given you the new birth of water and the Spirit and has forgiven all your sins. May He strengthen you with His grace all the days of your life. Peace be with you.

Amen.


THE WORD

Hear our prayers, Lord, for the sake of Jesus, whose journey to the cross we remember during the days of Lent. Comfort and strengthen us by His life and death on our behalf, and thrill us as we look forward to celebrating His victory on Easter.


