# T-Loop Hearing Assistance



#### **Confession & Absolution**

We recognize God as the perfect and holy Judge of all mankind. We acknowledge His righteous demands that we be holy as He is holy. And we admit that we are all guilty sinners. We too, by our thoughts, attitudes, words, and actions, have contributed to the pain and misery we see all around us. And so, we confess our sins before God:

I confess that nothing good lives in me, that is, in my sinful nature. My heart wrestles with pride, selfishness, and rebellion. I often experience sinful thoughts and desires. I often speak and act in ways that hurt and offend you and others. I have not made proper use of the time you have given us before the Great Judgment.

I know that nothing I do or say can earn forgiveness.

But I also know you are a loving and gracious God. You sent your Son to personally bear my sin on the cross. I come to you and lay the burden of my sin at the cross.

My heartfelt plea is that the blood of Jesus would cleanse me of my sin and set me free.


Silence for meditation and reflection upon the sins that trouble us . . .

It is my joy and privilege to announce to you that the Lord has taken all your sins and laid them on Jesus. He was condemned in your place.

Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Because of Christ's death you are forgiven. Because of his resurrection to life God declares you "not guilty." You are set free from sin to live for God here, and forever with him in heaven. Your Savior paid the debt you owe, and Satan cannot threaten you – there is no condemnation for those who trust in Him!

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.


# Second Reading

1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

<sup>1</sup>Now, brothers and sisters, about times and dates we do not need to write to you, <sup>2</sup>for you know very well that the day of the Lord will

come like a thief in the night. <sup>3</sup>While people are saying, "Peace and safety," destruction will come on them suddenly, as labor pains on a pregnant woman, and they will not escape.

<sup>4</sup>But you, brothers and sisters, are not in darkness so that this day should surprise you like a thief. <sup>5</sup>You are all children of the light and children of the day. We do not belong to the night or to the darkness. <sup>6</sup>So then, let us not be like others, who are asleep, but let us be awake and sober. <sup>7</sup>For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk, get drunk at night. <sup>8</sup>But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, putting on faith and love as a breastplate, and the hope of salvation as a helmet. <sup>9</sup>For God did not appoint us to suffer wrath but to receive salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>10</sup>He died for us so that, whether we are awake or asleep, we may live together with him. <sup>11</sup>Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing.

<sup>12</sup>But he replied, 'Truly I tell you, I don't know you.'

<sup>13</sup>Therefore keep watch, because you do not know the day or the hour."




We also then join in the prayer that the Son of Man has taught us:


#### Lord's Prayer
