


#### Blessing

#### **Confession & Absolution**

O God Almighty, you know we have not acted like the saints you have called us to be. You expect us to love you and others perfectly; to act like your special, chosen, holy people - all the time.

We confess to you, O Lord, that by our attitudes and actions we have sinned against you. We have not acted as the saints you want us to be. We have not loved you with all our heart, soul and mind.

We have not poured our efforts into living and proclaiming your Gospel here or throughout the world.

Yet, for the sake of Jesus, who was perfect in our place, we beg you to have mercy on us.

Because of his blood shed on the cross, forgive all our sins we humbly pray:

God, our Father, sent Jesus Christ who considered our souls worth the huge sacrifice he made. Though he was rich, yet for our sakes he became poor, that through his poverty we might share in his eternal riches. Because of Jesus you are righteous in God's sight and are forgiven — for all your sins. That means you ARE saints in His eyes. Because of his resurrection from the dead, death itself has been swallowed up in victory. You are his people, and will live with him forever. Do you believe this?

Yes, we believe. We are the forgiven and righteous saints of God. We have the gift of eternal life through faith in Christ Jesus. We are citizens of Heaven. We are ready and equipped by the Holy Spirit to be the kind of people that God wants us to be.

We now have peace with God through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Let us then praise him for the victory he has given us, and the glorious heavenly future we now have to look forward to:

First Reading Revelation 7:9–17

<sup>9</sup>After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands. <sup>10</sup>And they cried out in a loud voice:

"Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb."

<sup>11</sup>All the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures. They fell down on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, <sup>12</sup>saying:

"Amen! Praise and glory and wisdom and thanks and honor and power and strength be to our God for ever and ever. Amen!" <sup>13</sup>Then one of the elders asked me, "These in white robes—who are they, and where did they come from?"

<sup>14</sup>I answered, "Sir, you know."

And he said, "These are they who have come out of the great tribulation; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. <sup>15</sup>Therefore,

"they are before the throne of God and serve him day and night in his temple; and he who sits on the throne will shelter them with his presence.

<sup>16</sup>'Never again will they hunger; never again will they thirst.

The sun will not beat down on them,' nor any scorching heat.

<sup>17</sup>For the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd;

'he will lead them to springs of living water.'

'And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.'"

<sup>10</sup>Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness,


for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.






#### Lord's Prayer


