God's Word for this week

Scriptures teach that King Jesus is the Son of God in the flesh and the only hope for salvation. You do not approach meeting someone like that casually or carelessly. You prepare meticulously. What does that mean? What does a life of readiness—ready to meet such a King—look like? In one word: repentance. Throughout history, God has raised up called servants—like John the Baptist—to preach a message of repentance. Without repentance, the King's coming only terrifies. But all those who believe and repent can look forward to the coming of the King and the consummation of his everlasting kingdom.

2 Peter 3:8-14

⁸But do not forget this one thing, dear friends: With the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day. ⁹The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead he is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance.

¹⁰But the day of the Lord will come like a thief. The heavens will disappear with a roar; the elements will be destroyed by fire, and the earth and everything done in it will be laid bare.

¹¹Since everything will be destroyed in this way, what kind of people ought you to be? You ought to live holy and godly lives ¹²as you look forward to the day of God and speed its coming. That day will bring about the destruction of the heavens by fire, and the elements will melt in the heat. ¹³But in keeping with his promise we are looking forward to a new heaven and a new earth, where righteousness dwells.

¹⁴So then, dear friends, since you are looking forward to this, make every effort to be found spotless, blameless and at peace with him.

Alleluia. Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him. And all people will see God's salvation. Alleluia.




Gospel Reading Mark 1:1–8

¹The beginning of the good news about Jesus the Messiah, the Son of God, ²as it is written in Isaiah the prophet:

"I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way"—

3"a voice of one calling in the wilderness,
'Prepare the way for the Lord,
make straight paths for him.'"

⁴And so John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River. ⁶John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷And this was his message: "After me comes the one more powerful than I, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. ⁸I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

2 Peter 3:8-14 "Combining Patience & Preparation"





Lord's Prayer


Our Father, who art in heaven,

The peace of the Lord be with you always. **Amen.**




